Nominated students receive a generated email from the International Office to start the application process. For admission, students have to complete our online application form in time and provide us with all necessary documents.

### HOUSING

Students can choose between two kinds of accommodation: university residences (public or private) and the private rental sector. **For exchange students who apply for residencies in the public sector**: they automatically receive credentials by email, allowing them to access the online housing application platform. Students who meet the deadlines will receive an offer of accommodation from the International Students & Scholars Office (ISSO).

#### **IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS**

VISAS AND RESIDENCE PERMITS	Except for nationals of a European Economic Area country (European Union country (EU), Iceland, Norway and Liechtenstein) or Switzerland, students coming to study for more than 3 months must apply for a visa. HEALTH INSURANCE		
HEALTH INSURANCE	Subscription to health insurance is mandatory for stays of more than 3 months, unless there is a bilateral agreement between France and the student country of origin. Registration is free, but is no longer part of the university registration process. It is up to the students to follow the registration procedure upon arrival. <u>The UGA's Health Center</u> can respond to most student health care needs on campus.
